Main part

2. Social factors

Social dynamics, which are typically foundational to a student's learning experience, are also disrupted by uncertainty. Some of the key social factors include:

✓ **changes in the usual social environment**. The shift from in-person to online or hybrid learning environments, or even the disruption of school systems entirely, can result in a breakdown of the supportive social structures that previously motivated students to learn.

- ✓ **limited access to resources**. Restricted access [3] to educational materials, internet, and language practice opportunities, particularly in areas affected by conflict, hinders students' ability to maintain progress in English learning.
- ✓ uncertainty about the future. When students are unsure about their future, whether in terms of educational continuity or job opportunities, the perceived value of learning English diminishes. This uncertainty often results in a lack of motivation to invest effort in language proficiency.

3. Economic factors

Economic instability further exacerbates the decline in motivation, as financial pressures force students and their families to prioritize survival over education. The main economic factors include:

- ✓ **financial instability**. For many students, personal or family financial hardships create stress that competes with their ability to focus on academic goals.
- ✓ **job loss**. The reduction in employment opportunities and the increased likelihood of job loss due to economic disruptions contribute to a sense of hopelessness, making it difficult for students to see the practical benefits of learning English.
- ✓ **reduced employment opportunities**. In uncertain times, the perception that there are fewer professional prospects both domestically and internationally can reduce the perceived importance of learning English as a tool for future career success.

These factors collectively shape the context in which students approach their studies, underscoring the need for targeted strategies to help them maintain motivation in the face of these challenges.

Strategies for maintaining interest in learning English

To address the challenges posed by uncertainty and declining student motivation, it is essential to implement strategies that highlight the practical relevance of English and create a positive, engaging learning environment. The following approaches focus on maintaining students' interest in learning English and fostering long-term commitment.

1. Actualizing practical relevance
